



“THE NEW 990: What Your Organization—and Your Board— Need to Know for the Road Ahead”

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The new, redesigned Form 990 significantly changes reporting requirements for your nonprofit—which likely means changes to your accounting system, additional tracking, or new or revised policies and communications. Now the IRS wants to know in more detail:

- *How your organization sets executive compensation*
- *How much you're paying your executives*
- *How you handle potential conflicts of interest*
- *Whether you have a record retention policy*
- *Whether you have independent directors*
- *Whether you have a whistleblower policy*

If you serve on a board for a nonprofit, do you know how your organization handles these things?

If you are an executive director, board officer, CFO, or finance professional you need to prepare for the new requirements set forth in the New 990.
